


CERTIFICATES AND PRIZES

A NEW CRÈCHE FOR HERTZOGVILLE CHILDREN

The Department of Social Development, parents, children and community members and leaders gathered to celebrate the launch of the **Thari Ya Mme Educare Centre**, in Hertzogville, late last year.

This is one of Boshof Solar Power's flagship education projects, which provided an entire crèche that includes five fully equipped and furnished mobile classrooms that can easily and safely accommodate the 75 children that currently attend this facility.

Additionally, a palisade fence, toilets, an office, sick bay, and even equipped kitchen has been installed. The crèche also has a storeroom and most importantly outdoor play equipment and educational material to stimulate the love of learning.
